Happy 2020. On New Years Eve and into the next morning, Satanists celebrated the end of 2020 at TST Virtual Headquarters and TST-TV. VHQ wrapped up their week-long Sol Invictus celebration with an all-day live stream, only stopping to hand it off to TST TV's *Fuck Hindsight* variety show from TST Idaho. You can see the archived *Fuck Hindsight* on <u>TST TV</u>.

Ongoing legal campaigns. In January, The Satanic Temple highlighted its legal campaigns via their newsletter in six installments. Newsletter subscribers learned about the Judy Doe Missouri abortion case, the Lamar billboard lawsuit, the Belle Plaine Monument case, the Scottsdale Invocation case, the new Boston Religious Discrimination lawsuit, and the Arkansas Ten Commandments case. Judy Doe Abortion case. The Supreme Court declined to hear the Judy Doe abortion case. This unfortunately stalls this campaign, until or unless we have another instance of a Satanist's religious rights being violated while seeking or receiving reproductive healthcare, if that Satanist is willing to become the plaintiff in a new lawsuit.

Scottsdale invocation case. A date has been scheduled for oral arguments in the Scottsdale Invocation case. TST lawyer Matt Kezhaya announced that it will be on March 18, 2021 at 11:30 am CST, and that it will be livestreamed on www.ca9.uscourts.gov. A recording will be available the following day.

Ohio fetal burial requirement. On December 30th, Ohio enacted a new fetal burial regulation. The Satanic Temple asserts that this requirement is a violation of the First Amendment, and declares TST members to be exempt from this rule, which goes against our third Tenet. TST vows to defend the religious rights of Satanists in court, if necessary.

Boston invocation case. On January 20, The Satanic Temple filed suit against the city of Boston for denying its request to deliver an invocation, which are regularly delivered before their City Council meetings. The Boston City Council permits invocations only by invitation from Council members. The Satanic Temple has requested to deliver an invocation three times, and has been told that they do not accept requests. This gatekeeping ensures that only some religions are represented.

Public forum participation. On January 22, TST announced that it plans to provide a support system for members to participate in their local public forums, enabling us to contribute to religious diversity and promote inclusivity within our local communities. The announcement included a link to information on the Scottsdale Invocation case.

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TST app development. After we all realized once again how much power social media companies have over our lives and ability to communicate, the TST App opened up a "sanctuary" for official chapter members. It currently has only basic message boards and messaging capabilities, but it's important to take a step toward having a place of our own to organize that can't be taken away by a rogue algorithm or a vindictive troll. Historic home destroyed in New York. The 'Halloween House', formerly owned by a prominent member of the Church of Satan, <u>was destroyed by an arsonist</u>, potentially too badly to be restored. While this attack was not directed at The Satanic Temple, we should acknowledge the possibility that this was a religiously-motivated hate crime against Satanists. And whatever our feelings about CoS may be, we must condemn this act. We also might do well to show compassion and empathy to our fellow Satanists in the wake of this tragic event.

Anything for Jackson (2020), dir. Justin G. Dyck. Ah yes, the exorcism film - one of the classics of the horror genre. Beginning with *The Exorcist* in 1973, movies about innocent people possessed by demonic spirits heighten their scares by tapping directly into America's hellfire-and-brimstone cultural psyche. After fifty years of the trope, you probably know what to expect, but this movie turns the exorcism trope inside out: instead of removing a troubled spirit, the main characters - a pair of grieving grandparents - want to invoke a possession. Specifically, the possession of an unborn child by their dead grandson. And of course, the only way to do that is by kidnapping a pregnant woman, tying her up in a bedroom that doubles as a ritual chamber, and enlisting the help of the rest of their amateurish Satanic coven. (In what feels like a very intentional nod to plugged-in horror fans, one of the Satanists could

be an exact double for The Last Podcast on the Left's own Henry Zebrowski.) Anchored by a solid and sympathetic cast, Anything for Jackson doesn't quite live up to the promise of its premise, but it's still full of unexpected humor and genuinely creepy moments. You can find this spooky, thrilling romp streaming on Shudder.
