What are TST Arizona's needs and how can we apply our skills to rectify the ongoing wrongs in our state? Next week, our members have an opportunity to suggest or comment on new
Campaigns, and jumpstart some of the Campaigns put on hiatus during this pandemic year.
This will be a chance to contribute your ideas, art, and/or time to charity for our community.

No matter where each of us is in Arizona, we see injustice from time to time, and ought to work to remedy it. As a *group*, we're privileged over individual persons; we have power in numbers, and can use that power to bring together resources that could help needy populations in Arizona. Donations or work are the "action" part of the <u>first tenet</u>, but we must also act "with reason," targeting our compassionate action; acting to maximize the impact of our activities. If another nonprofit or religion has resources, logistics, or experience that would multiply the benefit provided by our efforts, we ought to try to work together with them.

Reasonable compassion and empathy in our *individual* actions has an interpretation for each situation and each individual. A thing I've considered with relation to personal charity is the intersection of the <u>first and fourth tenets</u>; act with compassion and empathy, but get consent for the type of action you'd like to engage in! That is, respect the freedoms of the person to whom you're offering help, and ask if they have a use for whatever resource you would like to offer. i.e. "hey, would you like a bedroll/meal/twenty?"

Whether you are a chapter member or someone who follows us online, you probably have the ability to help make our State a better place. Collaborate with us or volunteer on your own, but think and act nobly with compassion and empathy.

HELLFIRE CLUB






